*40%	 Tests (46 marks) will be given at the end of each unit. Questions for the test will come directly from the learning outcomes in the IB Syllabus. Quizzes/Group Presentations: Quizzes will be given at the midpoint of each unit. A Quiz may consist of short answer questions and vocabulary from units. Notes will occasionally be permitted to use on quizzes at the discretion of Mr. Freeman. Group Presentations will replace a quiz grade whenever they are done.
*40%	• Portfolio/Unit Reviews: Unit Portfolios will be collected at the end of unit and is a summative project that is done outside of class. Portfolio work days will occasionally be given at the discretion of Mr. Freeman
*20%	 Class Participation/: Even with high test and portfolio scores, students will still be required to participate positively in daily lectures. Students are graded holistically on their contribution to class discussions. Homework: Homework will usually consist of reading assignments and note taking
